University Grads of 2018 & 2019

One or two of our HS grads earn National Merit Scholarships to university every year, that's 3 X's the national rate. It covers tuition only so we support them with a computer and about \$60/mon for living expenses. It's a starvation allowance but it's all we can manage and they succeed remarkably well.



Simon is last of a widow's 8 children. We sponsored him through HS where he earned his Univ.scholarship. He studied Conservation and Ecology, was class leader in 3rd year and was only grad chosen by USA NGO for internship as researcher for Primate Protection. After 4 months he was offered a full time job, the dream of his life. Here he guides US student researchers through a National Park.

Clementine's single mom couldn't pay for HS so we did and she earned scholarship for university in Business. Already in her last year of univ. she began producing powered ginger and garlic for sale. Covid shut her down but she continues soliciting commercial customers and experiments with new products. She holds tenaciously to her goal of being an entrepreneur.





Emmanuel was a homeless orphan when we sponsored him to HS. He earned a National Merit scholarship and qualified for med school. He was twice class president and chosen for residency at Jefferson Hospital in Philadelphia. He graduated in 5 years and is now first year physician. He is deeply grateful and committed to serving poor communities like he came from. He will give back 100 X's what he has been given.

Theogen came from a 2 room mud hut where he barely survived since death of both parents. With our sponsorship he earned a scholarship, gradua- ting in Food Production and Processing. He did everything, including volunteer internships but couldn't land a job in his field. After marrying his childhood sweetheart - also an orphan - he worked selling wedding outfits. After 2 years he bought out his boss and In 2019, this orphan from a mud hut flew to China to buy a rack of new dresses.
