#### **New Scholarship Student**

Ayda applied for a scholarship this year. In her application for a scholarship, she said "she has the goal of being a veterinarian, to provide good treatment of animals, to specialize in contributing to medicine and good health, to avoid the mistreatment of animals, and to work in harmony with the environment."

Ayda is a very smart, diligent, friendly, 12 year old girl. Her father passed away 13 months ago, and she lives with her mother and older brother, both of whom work but make only enough for the family's basic needs. Ayda finished Grade 6 with good grades. She recognizes that studying is important and wants to continue her studies, socialize more and obtain new knowledge. She is doing well in her middle school studies.





## English & Technology Classes

In addition to extra classes in English and technology, our scholarship students have the opportunity to join with other students sponsored by the NGO FORMA, administered by our fabulous local leaders Candelaria and Gregorio. This exposure to a wider group of enthusiastic learners really expands their horizons.

#### Scholarship Students volunteer at La Casita

Each scholarship student volunteers time at La Casita, to give back. Several of them teach the younger children, others volunteer in the garden or with meals and activities for the elderly widows who attend twice weekly lunch sessions.

#### **Community Outreach**

One of the very innovative programs initiated by Ana Olivia (our Community Outreach Coordinator) is a year-long series of workshops for women in the community. Many are illiterate and not convinced of the value of education. The monthly sessions, focusing on nutrition, health and various activities aimed at increasing self-esteem, have resulted in increased support of their children in the scholarship program.



#### First Reunion

The first reunion of past and present scholarship students was held just last July. What a success!

Gregorio facilitated a session on finance, banking and credit card use that was much appreciated. Many people are quite fearful of the banks and hide the little money they have in their homes.

During the afternoon the graduates talked about how grateful they were, how **La Casita** had supported them, and what a huge difference having that support made in their lives and how they view their future potential.

Some comments from the session:

- \*'Grasp opportunities that are presented to you',
- \*'Education opens minds'
- \*Educated young people positively influence their parents and the community,
- \*'We will help each other'.

Many of the graduates have stayed in the community. Alex has become an auto mechanic, and has opened his own

car repair shop. Leonardo initiated a successful fish farm in San Antonio Palopo. Our coordinator, Ana Olivia, began as a scholarship student and now has a degree in social work and very capably works with the teachers at **La Casita**. Melina is thinking about starting a CoOp. Froilan would like to start solar panel projects in the town. Antonio is teaching the evening computer classes at La Casita and has decided to open a pharmacy in nearby San Lucas.

#### **Orientation for Public School Teachers**

About 80 children, referred by the two elementary schools, attend remedial classes in the mornings and afternoons at La Casita. The increased attendance relates partly to two very successful outreach sessions held with the local teachers. Candelaria and Gregorio facilitated an Orientation Meeting with the local teachers informing them about all of the different programs and resources available at La Casita. They were particularly impressed by the peaceful green gardens outside, the quality of our teacher's methods, and the warmth and charm of the learning centre's space.
