

Report from San Antonio Palopó October 2025



Last week, for the very first time, Candelaria and Gregorio, the two Administrators of La Casita, were able to visit Victoria. We organized a gathering of friends and supporters at the University Club to welcome them and hear their story and more about the role of La Casita in the village. The gathering started with a short history of La Casita beginning with our first connection with the village of San Antonio Palopó almost 20 years

ago. Candelaria and Gregorio, along with their son Pablo, gave an inspiring presentation. They have

administered *La Casita* in the small Guatemalan village of San Antonio Palopó, for the last 8 years. Their dedication to empowering Guatemalan youth and determination to provide the necessary environment and attitude for learning drives their

spirits and is quite contagious. Gregorio and Candelaria talked about fostering a family atmosphere and promoting their values: respect,

responsibility, punctuality, innovation, empathy, and equality. Their

management and mentorship of the staff and students have truly been exemplary.
